

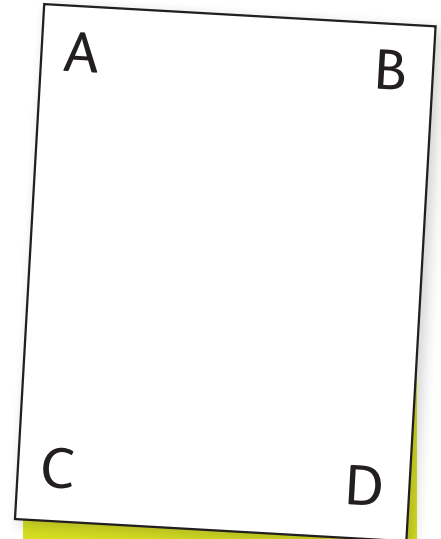
# Origami Instructions for your Snow Pea Pots

1. Use  $\frac{1}{4}$  sheet of newspaper (don't use colour or glossy newspapers – might prove harmful to seeds and soil) for a small pot suitable for one Snow Pea seed. Spread it out on a clean, flat surface, short side towards you.
2. Mark the 4 corners A, B, C, D as shown.
3. With the short side (C, D) nearest you, fold in half so C meets A and D meets B. Crease well. Then fold again, so D and B meet A and C.
4. Next, open out the top layer (B) whilst holding A, C and D so a triangular pocket is formed. Press this down along the central spine. Replace D onto B.
5. Flip it over and do the same with A and C as you did with B and D.

It should now resemble a paper aeroplane.

6. Next, fold A inwards until the straight edge is along the central crease and then fold in again. Repeat with side B.
9. Flip it over and repeat with C and D.
10. Fold the top flaps down and crease well. You can leave them outside the pot or fold them inside. They can also be used to link the pots together.
11. Square the bottom of the pot to make sure it stands well and it's ready for the soil.
12. Plant one of you Snow Peas in each pot.

**Tip 1:**

To make your pot stronger you can use two layers of newspaper.

**Tip 2:**

When your seedling has germinated, the whole pot can be transplanted into the garden as the newspaper is biodegradable.
